

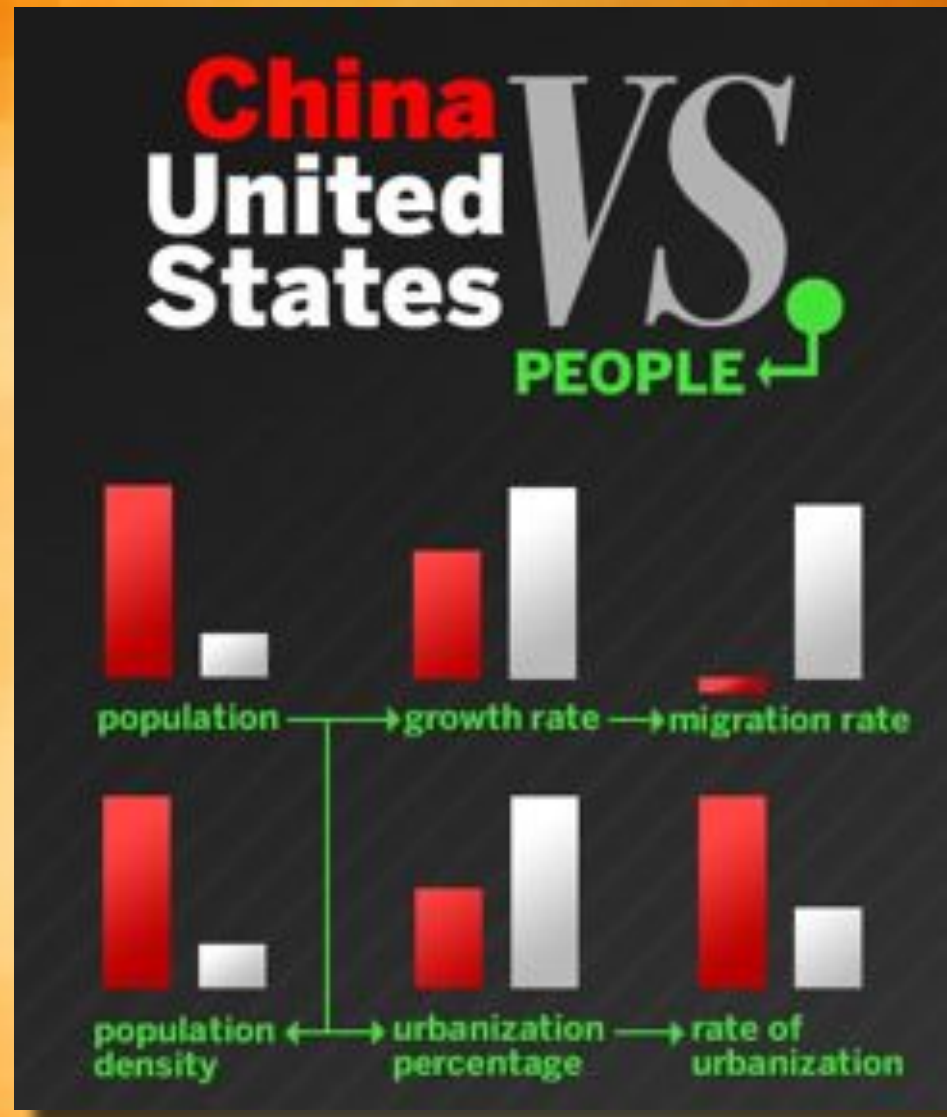



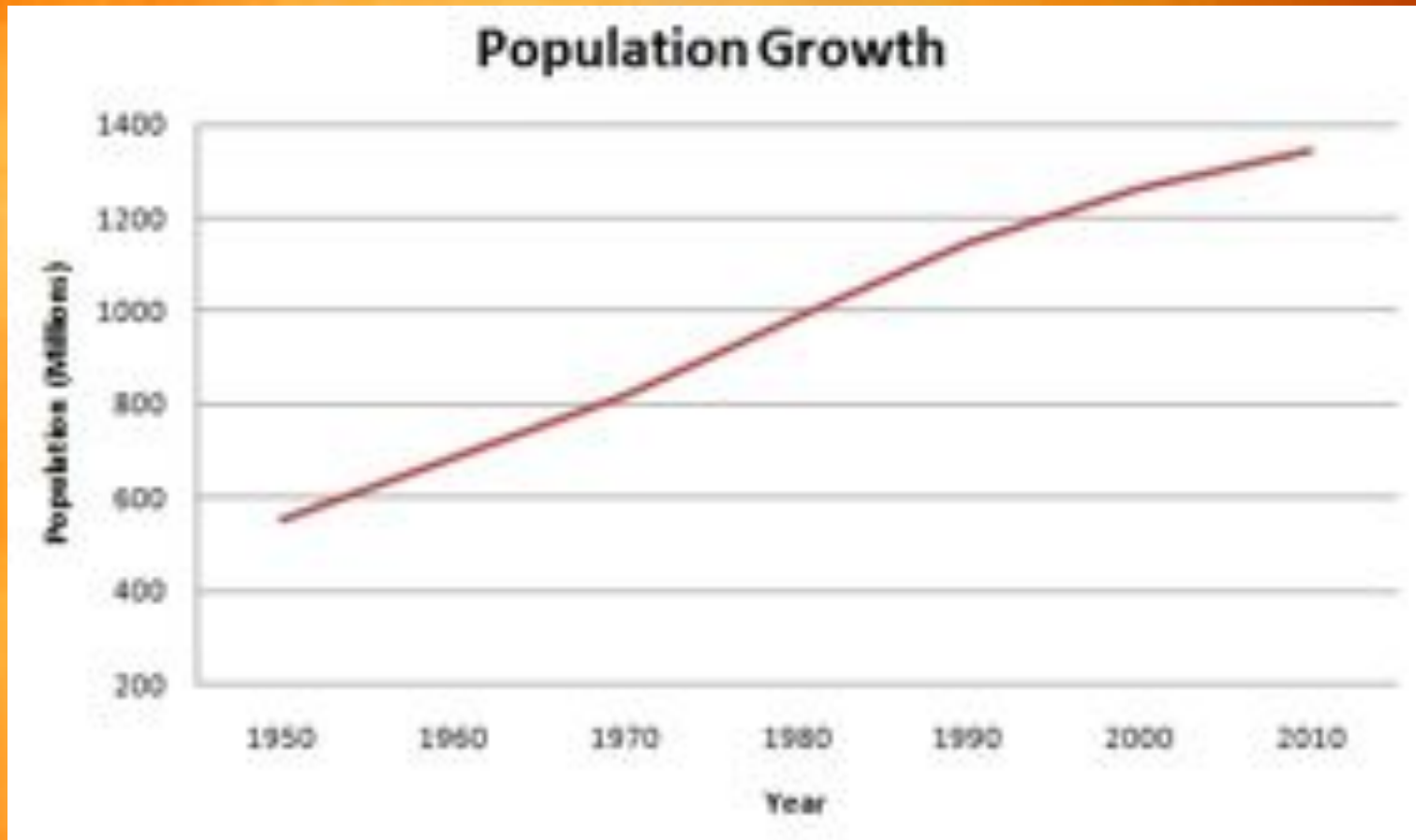

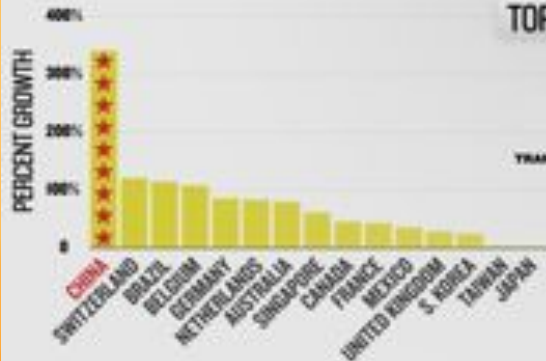

2007-2008



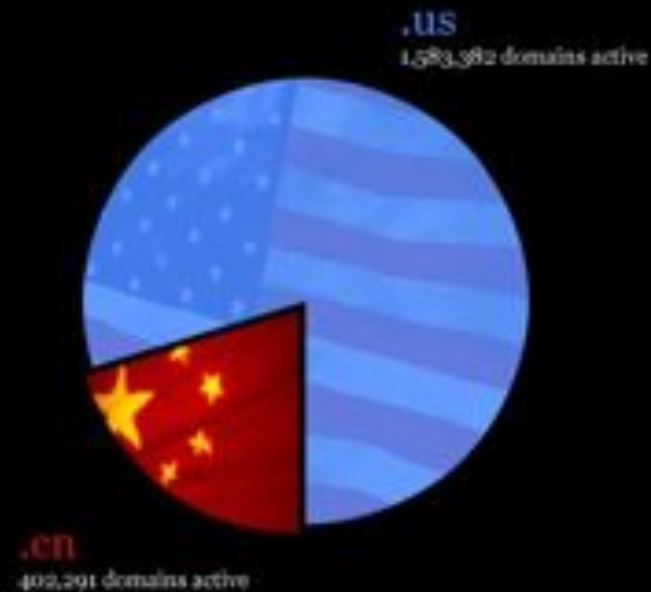

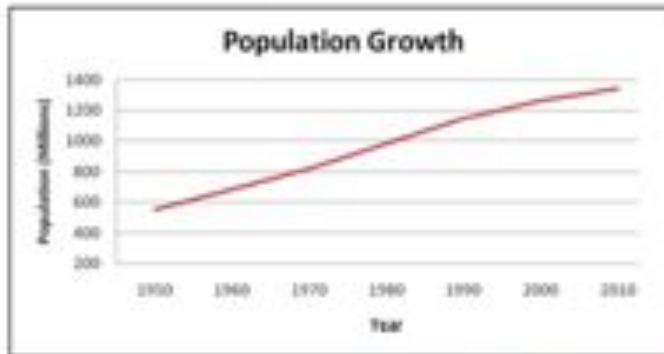
